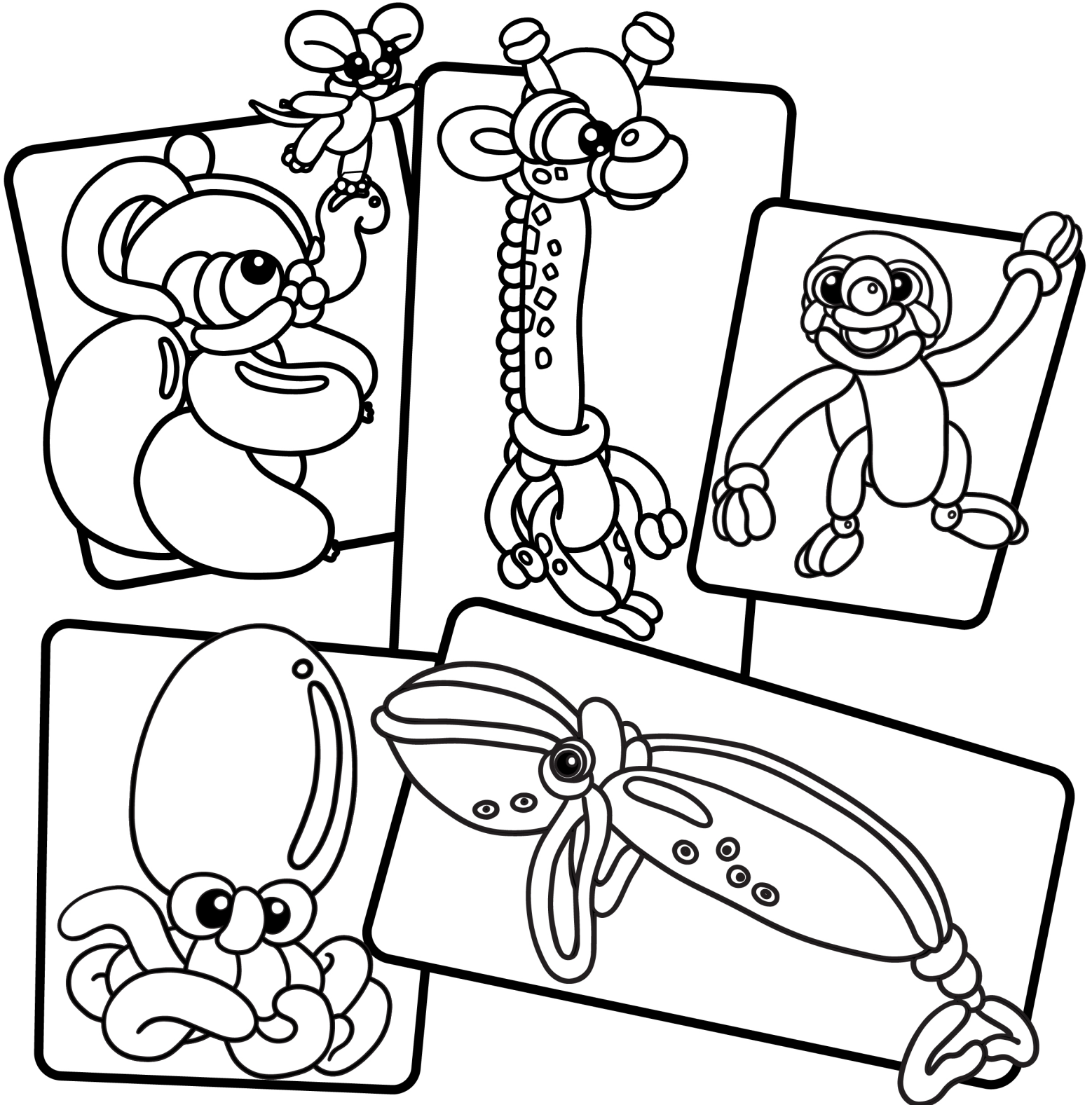


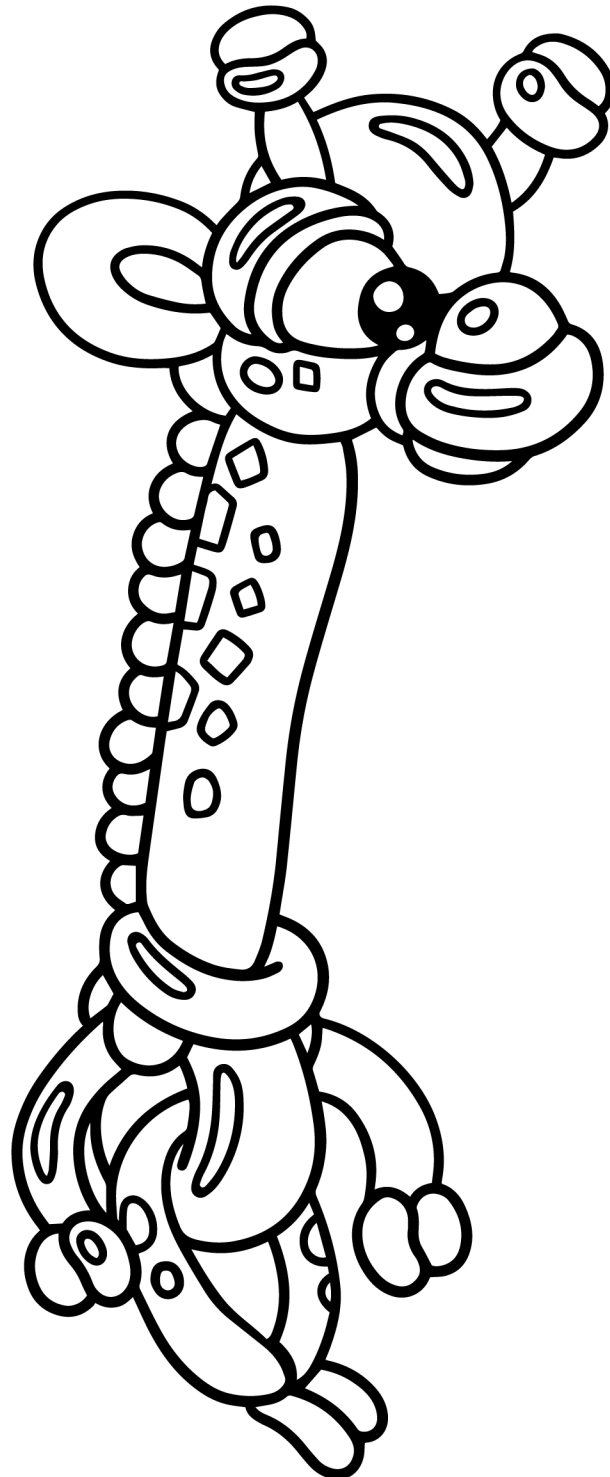

Fun Fact Coloring Pack



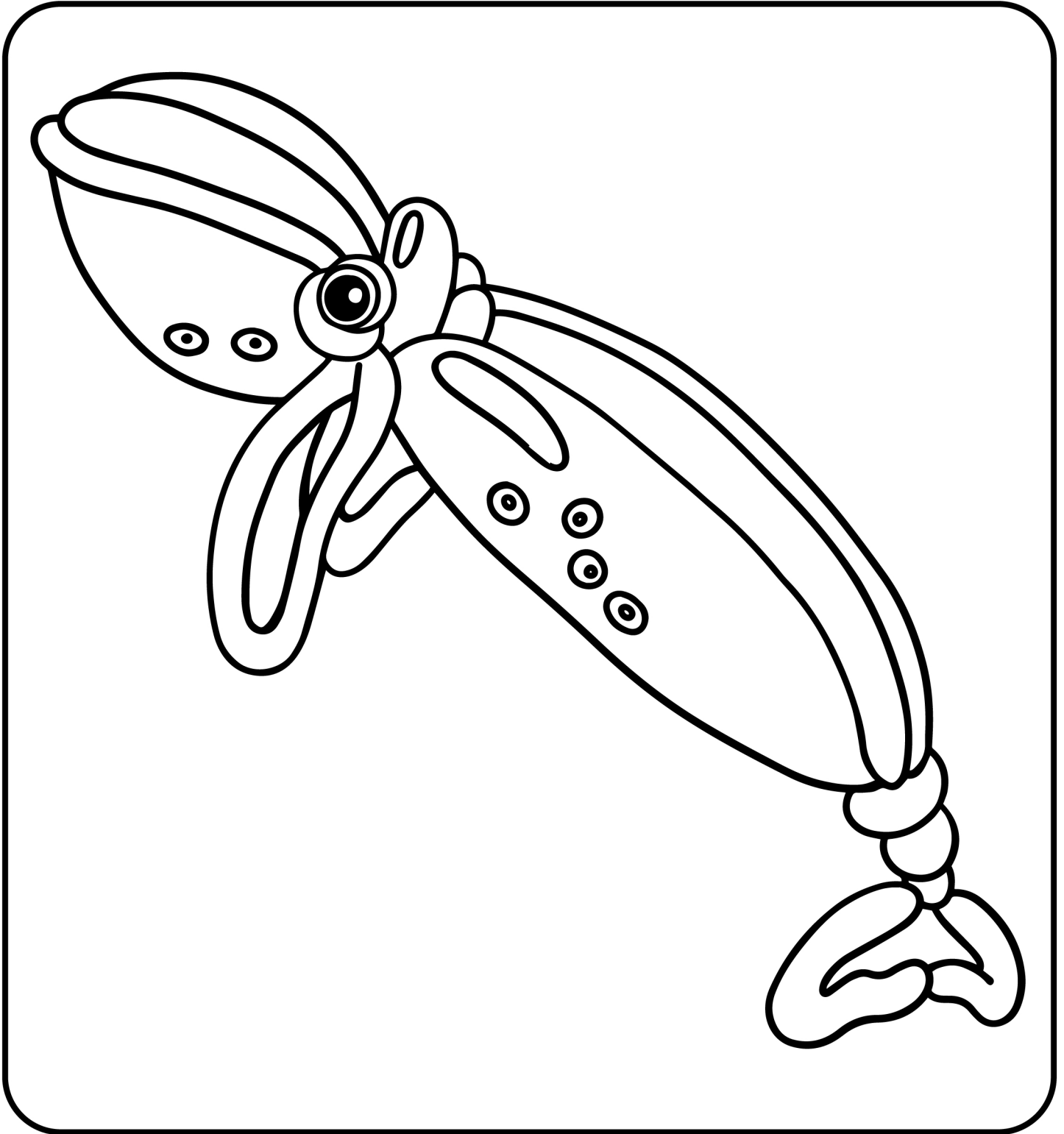
**Giraffes may look like they have horns, but they don't – they have ossicones.

a giraffe have? What kind of spots do they have? Don't forget to add awesome ossicones!*



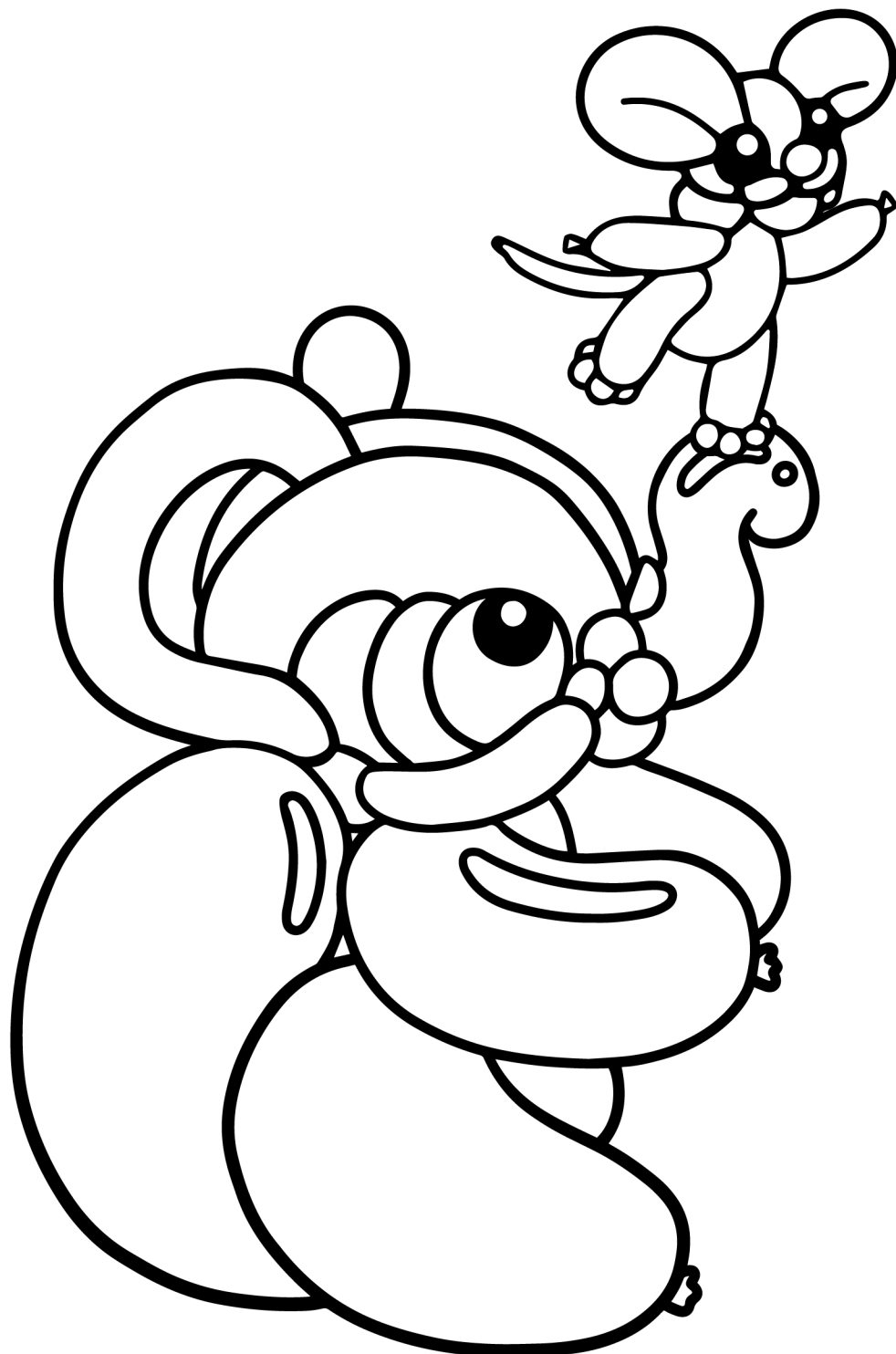
Blue whales are the largest animals that ever lived on the entire planet. If dinosaurs were still roaming the earth, blue whales would be even larger than they were!

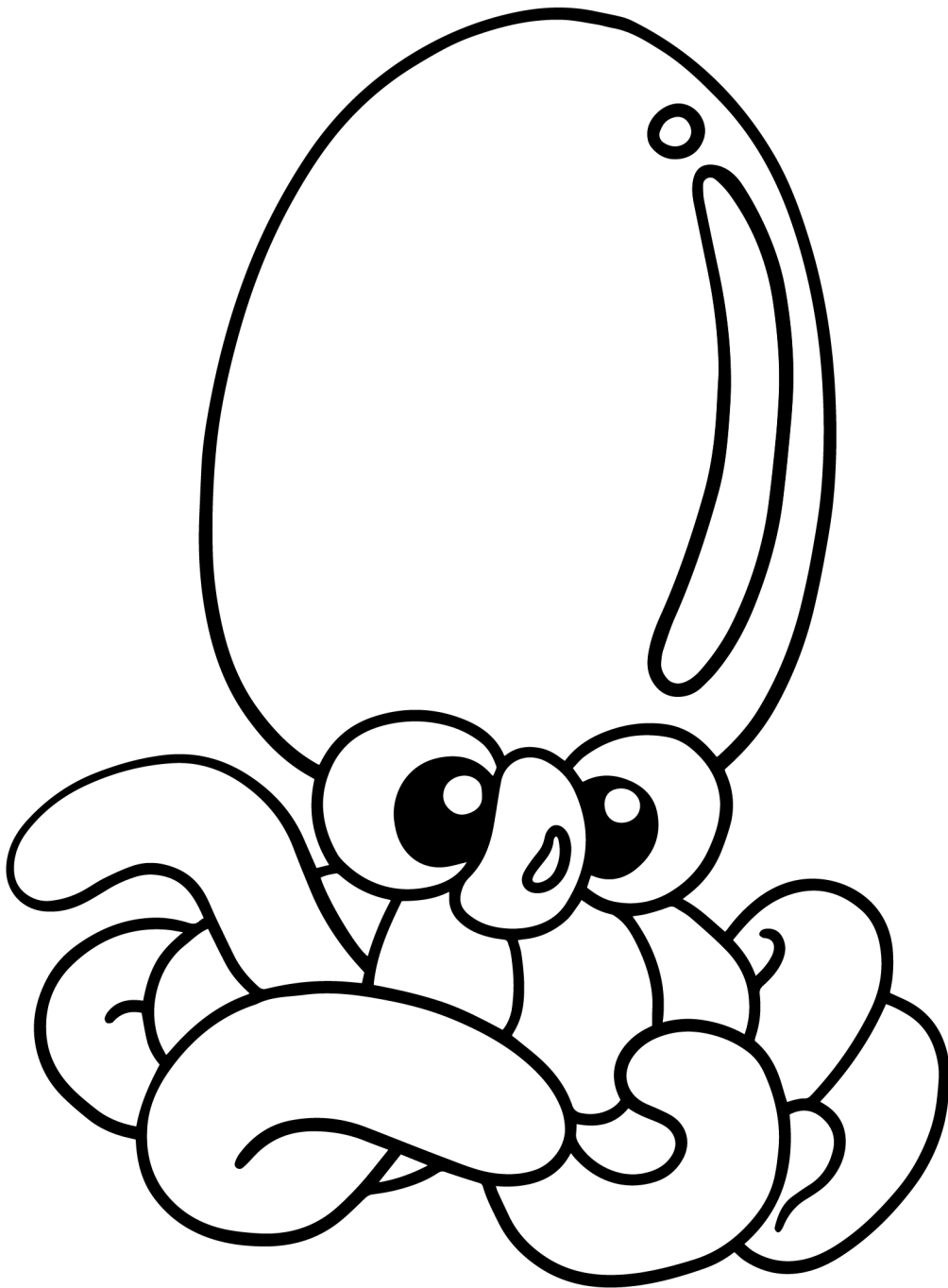


Octopuses are very intelligent animals who have been known to use tools (like coconut shells), solve puzzles, and open containers!
